SMA Directors' Meeting Minutes
May 15, 2024
Via Zoom
7:00 pm

In attendance: Directors Bob Dodge, Carson Hanrahan, Russ Pinizzotto, Howie Marshall, Paul Howell, Mike Simmons, Dave Gay, Kevin Kane, Jeremy Wright and Rob Burgess and club members Al DiSabatino, and Dave Crocker. A quorum was present.

The minutes of the April 24, 2024 meeting were approved.

Follow-Up on Action Items and Committee Reports:

New Directors indicated their committee preferences as follows:

Rob asked the new board members to review secondary roles they could play in administration of the club to provide back-up support to existing committee chairs.

Program Committee: Russ

- Russ and Carson are to choose four or five topics for beginners for our June meeting. We decided to offer two annually (the second in November) aimed at members new to the hobby. Russ and Carson will try to find other club members to present on these topics rather than doing all the work themselves. Speakers for other meetings were actively being solicited by the Program Committee. Many prospective speakers were looking for dates in the fall, given academic commitments. We are still seeking a NASA speaker on the Deep Space Network, on its 60th anniversary. ACTION ITEM: Rob will reach out to Spirit Aero Systems in Biddeford to discuss their role in supplying heat resistant materials for planetary missions.

Rob reported that the Open House/20th Anniversary Celebration initially proposed for late Aprill or early May needed to be postponed until later in the season, possibly in mid-July. Equipment to be sold has been identified and research on pricing is underway. This could be a rain or shine event as we now have tents (10x10 and 10x20) to cover if necessary.

Rob said he would reach out to the Brunswick Topsham Land Trust, the Maine Coast Heritage
Trust and Maine's First Ship, to invite joint events in 2024. These organizations all requested
star parties in 2023 we couldn't accommodate. This was an ACTION ITEM.

Dark Sky Committee: Rob, Howie, Jeremy

As a Board Member again Paul thought he could better serve the club by handling our webpage
and electronic messaging and accordingly has withdrawn from the Dark Sky Committee, at least
from an Org Chart perspective. Ara did a masterful job in setting up our new webpage several
years ago, as did Kevin in keeping announcements updated. But these were all ancillary duties
for both of them. The use of the page for related materials and constant announcements

- demands a webmaster (is that term still in use?) to be responsible for the quick responsiveness needed today.
- **ACTION ITEM:** Paul will now work with Jeremy and others to get the Google Map of our recommended star gazing sites up on our webpage.
- ACTION ITEM: Rob will put together some dark sky advice for our webpage from the DSI
 website that can guide people on their choices for outdoor lighting needs. We will also provide
 links to DSI, Dark Sky Maine and other resources.
- Rob informed that the Town of Brunswick is finally ready to take up lighting amendments to its
 zoning ordinance. He has submitted some draft language that will appear before the Planning
 Board in a workshop session on May 28.
- Efforts to modernize DSM's organizational structure, including to eventually seek chapter status by Dark Sky International, continue. Rob is representing SMA in those efforts but he welcomes others' participation.
- The Land Use Planning Commission has started the formal process preceding a formal rulemaking on updating its lighting ordinance for its 10.4 million acres of jurisdiction. We will engage in those proceedings once they begin and invite public comment.
- Jeremy reiterated he would undertake an informal survey of several retailers looking for low CCT bulbs and dark sky-friendly light fixtures to better understand what's in the marketplace locally. This will enable us to advise people seeking to do the right thing and perhaps push those retailers on the type of inventory they carry, if necessary.

Membership Committee: Dave and Kevin

- All and Dave are working on transitioning all responsibilities related to membership. Dave also indicated he would assume the responsibility of reporting to Night Sky Network to keep us current with that platform.
- Al reported that the club's current membership moved up by three to 87. Seventeen of our members are woman, maintaining the approximate level of 25% female membership.
- Rob reported that as of May 15 there were 187 participants in Google Groups and that several requests to join are received monthly.
- Al has previously discussed a few membership questions that should be resolved: how, when and for how long should honorary memberships be maintained (Jerry LaSala and Ed Gleason); should former members (who are not dues-paying) remain on the roster (George Whitney); should donors who make a contribution of more than the Lifetime Membership level (\$1,000) become automatic lifetime members if the donation came from a charitable trust and not the individual (could affect the tax benefit of the donor organization if an individual received a benefit); and can we continue to advertise free admission to the Southworth Planetarium with a new planetarium director? We hope Al will continue to identify the cracks in our membership structure even though he is now off the board!

- Once list pricing is determined the club will offer these items to club members at a discount off of
 the list price for several weeks. Items will then be offered to other clubs in the state. Whatever
 remains unsold will be available for purchase at the Open House.
- The C-8 and C-11 that Carson refurbished (with out-of-pocket expenditures of \$832 and 2,092, respectively) the club agreed to keep. Carson offered to house the equipment at his home for use at southern Maine star parties. Carson also graciously deferred seeking reimbursement for the equipment upgrades until such time as the club chose to sell the equipment (if to him, at net of out-of pocket expenditures, and if to third parties, then with reimbursement to him of out-of-pocket expenditures).

- Directors were encouraged to think of wish list items to bring retained equipment fully up to date, and/or enhanced, to provide the best experience possible for users.
- The club has received several recommendations from members regarding the equipment loan program, and how it was an inducement to join SMA. It was stressed that we needed an updated tab on the club webpage promoting this benefit, with pictures showing what was available, and procedures on how to borrow.

Treasurer's Report/Finance Committee: Bob

• Bob reported that as of 5/15/24 the club had \$9,858.23 in its operating account. The club also has a \$10,000 in a 15-month CD at Bangor Savings with a yield of 3.82%, with a current account balance of \$10,061.66.
